



Prospective FSA Graduate Student:

Thank you for your interest in the Fire Programs at Arizona State University East. The College of Technology and Applied Science offers a **Master of Science** Degree in Technology (MST) with a concentration in **Fire Service Administration** (FSA). The fire service administration concentration is the advanced study of fire administration and leadership concepts designed to prepare students to occupy executive-level positions in public and private fire service organizations and to conduct meaningful research in the area of fire service management and administration.

The MST degree is a 33-semester-hour post-baccalaureate degree program. The college requires an undergraduate grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 for regular admission. Students may be admitted on probationary status with a GPA below 3.0. The program includes 21 semester-hours of technical concentration where courses are chosen from a list of fire service administration courses. All students are also required to complete a 3 semester-hour research course plus, write and defend an applied research project.

The Fire Programs' faculty includes fire service professionals and practitioners who are highly respected in the fire service and who have the required academic credentials to teach at a **Research I University**. Each faculty member brings something special to the classroom through a unique combination of academic credentials and practical experience in the fire service, which results in providing students a rich and robust educational experience.

The MST-FSA program is taught **in Arizona only**, in a **hybrid format**. That is, students attend courses every other week and complete the balance of their work online. Courses are offered in three convenient locations: ASU Downtown Campus in Phoenix, at the Tucson Public Safety Academy in Tucson, and at the Coconino Community College Campus in Flagstaff. For those students attending from out-of-state, ASU East offers residence halls with large private rooms, a private bath, and a shared kitchenette.
